Bhumi organised a campaign on road safety awareness on several traffic signals in Chennai. The volunteers stood with placards at traffic signals displaying messages about road safety and also spoke to the bikers and car drivers.



SOS India organised a workshop in their communities across Jammu & Punjab that entailed painting about the social issues affecting the community. Through the medium of art, children expressed their thoughts about various social evils plaguing the society and the changes needed.

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The students of Shaheed Bhagat Singh Evening College visited the slums around Lodhi Road and had discussions with people about their living and sanitation conditions. They also gathered the women over there and tried to spread awareness among them about good sanitary habits and provided them with sanitary napkins.

A number of events were organized to sensitize the people towards the importance of Digital Literacy and also give them a hands on learning experience. They held competetions ranging from Typing Test, Digital Artist, Most Stylish Name, General Quiz, etc. and also activedemonstrations of use of E-Wallets, writing a cheque correctly, enhancing digital security against threats, E-Commerce, online Jobs, etc. Several presentations, interactive sessions, live demos, etc. were conducted in this regard.

Enactus Club of NSIT organized an awareness campaign in the district of Madanpur Khadar, Sarita Vihar as a part of Project Drinking Water. The objective behind the campaign was to educate the community towards water purification activities that can be used from time to time to ensure that no one suffers due to the poor supply of drinking water in Madanpur Khadar. Boiling of water, Storage in earthen pots and Utilisation of potash alum were some of the methods on which the people were informed. The campaign turned out to be a successful initiative and we hope that Project Drinking Water impacts as many lives as possible.
