People in the slums are still unaware of many health related problems, especially the women who do not easily visit a doctor. We invited a Lady Doctor to resolve their issues. It was an eye opening scenario for me.

I am a Manager in a Nationalized Bank and I was surprised to know that in spite of various Govt. campaigns and schemes, still around 95% of slum area people don't have a Bank Account. They don't know the benefits of Banking. We have motivated them to open a Bank Account and assured them that we will make them learn basic banking process such as cash deposit and cash withdrawal through ATM.










An awareness campaign on the importance of education for children was conducted in Mangolpuri area by Sahyog Care for You
